It would do so by prioritizing some of the following: hiring, training, and retaining detectives to investigate homicides and shootings; acquiring and upgrading technology; incentivizing the development of agency best practices; and ensuring that victims of violent crimes and family members of homicide victims have access to resources, including mental health treatment, grief counseling, and more.
